## **Report by County Councillor Bob Johnston**

I fear you will have to accept my apologies. I am chairing a meeting in Eynsham at 6pm and I don't think I will be able to get from there to South Hinksey in good time for your meeting. However, I have set out a report below.

- 1. The planning application for Lodge Hill will now go to committee later than previously thought. Currently I do not have a date. Meanwhile the works in respect of traffic calming I am assured are going on in parallel, including the weight limit on the A4183.
- 2. A planning application to replace the bridge over the railway on the Eastern by-pass is also being progressed. It will be built in two parts alongside the current structure and then slid into place to minimise disruption.
  - It will feature a new bus lane and a shared footpath and cycle track. It will also provide for the passage of the Oxford Relief Channel with part of the work being paid for by the Environment Agency.
- 3. Tomorrow it is as certain as one can be that the rise in the County Council element of the Council Tax will be 4.99%. As previously explained, this is to shore up the Social Services budgets and start to address the deficit on special needs transport (SEND). Low income households will get a £200 rebate which will operate in parallel with the Vale Council Tax reduction scheme aimed at the same group.
